
















For children living and learning in today's world, using the Internet is often a necessity. But that doesn't mean it can't be a **safe and creative space** for them to **explore and learn**.

Let's take a look at some ways Microsoft Edge is helping keep kids safe online while giving parents peace of mind.
























Privacy settings














Age-appropriate content














Personalized and curated just for them


